

# Enhancing the natural beauty of the National Shrine plant by plant



On most mornings before joining his Carmelite brothers for prayer and Mass at the priory, Fr. Gerard, Rector of the National Shrine, can be seen watering the many new plants and bushes that have been recently planted in the on-going National Shrine beautification program. Father Gerard shares with the Scapular bulletin readers a word about the program: "This month we continued with the beautification of the grounds of the Shrine of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. Through the generous donation of the Statue of St. Therese by Sr Peggy Murphy, O.P., We upgraded the St Therese Garden, and through the kind donations we have received from donors and from our Bake Sale, we have also upgraded the space in front of the statue of Our Lady of Lourdes and restored the Mary Garden in front of the Outdoor Scapular Vision Statue. The First Mary Garden in the Shrine of Our Lady of Mount Carmel was planted in front of the Scapular Vision Statue while Fr Francis Amodio was Shrine Director. The tradition of the Mary Garden goes back to medieval times, when various plants and herbs were planted to symbolize a virtue of the Blessed Virgin Mary. These differ from country to country. Among the plants found in a traditional Mary Garden include - impatiens -"Our Lady's earrings" – symbolizing the adornment of the ears of Mary who heard the word of God and kept it; Violet - symbolizing Mary's humility; Lady-Slipper - symbolizing Our Lady's Visitation to her cousin Elizabeth in the hill country; Marigold - Mary's Gold symbolizing her heavenly glory, Larkspur\ Delphinium – symbolizing Mary's tears and sorrows; Rose - often associated with Mary - mystical rose, symbolizing her purity,

grace; Lavender – Mary's drying plant symbolizing healing and protection, Tulip – Mary's prayer – symbolizing her own life of prayer and devotion to God; Baby's Breath symbolizing her purity and the overshadowing of the Holy Spirit; Lily symbolizing her purity, innocence and Immaculate Conception."

# Celebrating July's Carmelite Saints and Blesseds

Elijah is considered to be the Father of Carmelites, as the Carmelite way of life embodies the Elijahan tradition. Father Elijah's spirit of prayer, penance, contemplation, and zeal for the Lord is to this day the very spirit of the Carmelites. During his ministry, Elijah went up to Mount Carmel in Palestine to live and to pray. It was there that he taught and trained his followers, who are considered by some to be the first monks. From that time onward, Mount Carmel has always been inhabited by men seeking union with God. It is also believed that Elijah and the monks living on Mt. Carmel had a devotion to the woman who would be the mother of the Messiah, the Blessed Virgin Mary, long before she was born.

Elijah's end was as quick and mysterious as his beginning. One day as he was speaking with his successor Elisha, "a fiery chariot, and fiery horses parted them both asunder, and Elijah went up by a whirlwind into heaven" (2 Kings:11) Elijah appeared along with Moses at the Transfiguration of the Jesus on Mount Tabor. **His feast is celebrated on July 20.** 





Jane Scopelli (1428 – 9 July 1491) was an Italian Roman Catholic from Reggio Emilia who was a religious from the Carmelites and established her own convent as its first prioress. Scopelli was forbidden to enter the third order branch of that order during her adolescence and waited until her parents died to embrace the religious life.

Scopelli was given the title "Servant of God in 1500 by Pope Alexander. She was beatified on 24 August 1771 under Pope Clement XIV when the latter approved her local 'cultus' – otherwise known as popular devotion – and thus ratified her beatification. **Her feast is celebrated on July 9.** 

Louis Martin was born in Bordeaux, on August 22, 1823. While he was master-watchmaker in Alençon, where he met Marie Azelie (Zelie) Guerin, a lace maker. They were married on July 13, 1858, and had nine children, including the future Saint Therese of the Infant Jesus. Model spouses, devoted parents, workers, attentive to the poor, always nourishing a missionary spirit, they found their strength and hope in regular attendance at Holy Mass and in a deep devotion to the Blessed Virgin. After a long illness Zelie died in Alençon on August 28, 1877. Louis, in retirement, went to Lisieux near his in-laws to ensure a better future for his five children. He died on July 29, 1894.

The home that Louis and Zélie created nurtured the sanctity of all their children, but especially their youngest, who is known to us as Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus. Louis and Zélie were beatified in 2008, and canonized by Pope Francis on October 18, 2015. **The liturgical feast of Saints Louis Martin and Zélie Guérin is celebrated on July 12.** 





#### Teresa of Jesus of Los Andes

was a Chilean nun of the Discalced Carmelites She was a pious child but had an often unpredictable temperament; she seemed transformed when she decided to become a nun. Her character when she dedicates herself to the service of God. Her time in the convent was cut short when an aggressive disease killed her

Pope John Paul II canonized her March 21, 1993. Her feast day is celebrated on July 13.



#### The Martyrs of Campiegne

As the height of the French Revolution, 16 Discalced Carmelites from the Monastery of the Incarnatione offered their lives as a sacrifice to God. On June 24, 1794, they were arrested and condemned to death for their fidelity to the Church. Having renewed their vows before Teresa of St. Augustine, they were put to death in Paris on July 17, 1794.

They were beatified by Saint Pius X on May 13, 1906. **Their feast day is July 17.** 



John Soreth entered the Carmelite house in Normandy where he was ordained around 1417. He was unflagging in his efforts at renewal, during what was an especially critical period for both the Church and the Order. He dedicated himself entirely to the reform of the Order, travelling across Europe, making canonical visitations and promoting a more faithful observance of religious life both in the older Provinces and

convents and in the Mantuan Reformed Congregation. He was instrumental in the development of the Lay Carmelite Third Order. He died at Angers on July 25, 1471. He was beatified by Pope Pius IX in 1866. **His feast day is July 24.** 





Titus Brandsma, O.Carm., born Anno Sjoerd Brandsma on February 23, 1881, was a Dutch Carmelite friar, journalist and professor of philosophy. Brandsma was vehemently opposed to Nazi ideology and spoke out against it many times as a newspaper editor before the Second World War. He was imprisoned at the Dachau concentration camp, where he was put to death on July 26, 1942. He was beatified by the Catholic Church in November 1985 as a martyr of the faith and canonized as a saint on May 15, 2022 by Pope Francis. The Province's Fr. Michael Driscoll's O. Carm. miraculous healing was used in Brandsma's canonization process. Feast Day: July 27.
