A bounty of gifts to the National Shrine

The Discalced Carmelite Nuns of Beacon (NY) faced the same problem confronting a growing number of religious communities. Founded at a time when vocations were plentiful, most religious orders establised magnifient monasties in the most beautiful locations across America. With the steady decline of vocations many religious communities joined with other communities to remain viable. However, It became impossible for most of them to maintain large monasteries. Difficult choices were made.

This became a reality for the Carmelite nuns in Beacon. They had to close their monastery, but not before sharing their gifts with the National Shrine at Our Lady of Mount Carmel helping to enhance the beauty of our property.

A little bit about our benefactors: The Carmel of the Archdiocese of New York was the fourteenth founded in the United States and the last foundation of Baltimore Carmel. The five foundresses arrived in New York City on July 15, 1920. They lived for several months in a brownstone apartment until relocating to the Bronx.

In 1982 the Bronx Carmelite community relocated to Beacon, New York. Early in 2001 the three monasteries of Barre, Beacon and Saranac Lake united to form a new community, the Carmel of the Incarnation. The Beacon monastery was chosen as home for the new community.

Although the decision to close the Beacon Monastery, where the New York Province of St. Elias often gathered for their Annual General Meetings, was most difficult, the community met with Fr. Gerard Tang Choon, O. Carm, Rector of the National Shrine of Our Lady of Mount Carmel to help find a home for the many treasures that had adorneed their monastery.

Fr. Gerard, who has an appreciation for religious art and artifacts, marveled at the eclectic collection of paintings, statues, photographs, furniture, etc. at the Beacon monastry. It didn't take him but a few minutes to accept the offer to find a new home for these treasures.

It took many trips for Fr. Gerard and Anthony Annunziata, a Shrine Associate who has dedicated himself to helping beautify the Shrine, to move the donated items to Middletown. What Fr. Gerard and Anthony couldn't fit in their cars, outside helpers completed the job.

Visitors to the Shrine will begin to recognize the addition of new artwork and stautes both inside the Shrine and on the grounds. (Photographs of many of the new treasures can be found on the second page of the bulletin.)

Fr. Gerard asks your prayers for the kindness of the Carmelite nuns of Beacon as they enter yet another stage in their transormation as a religious community.

Some of the National Shrine's New Treasures





Born in the United States, Maxine lived in Salzburg, Austria as a young girl before settling in Bullville (NY) when she was nine years old. It was there that she first encountered the Carmelites, as a member of St. Paul's choir in Bullville (NY). Maxine says she remembered two women who sang in the choir. "They would sing the most wonderful duets like Mozart's *Ave Verum Corpus* and Cesar Franck's *Panis Angelicus*. Their singing inspired me. I owe my love of Church music to them and also to my time as a young voice in the choir."

Maxine joined the Carmelite's Our Lady of the Assumption (Bloomingburg) choir in 1978, and a year later was ther named the Choir Director. At the request of Fr. Sean Harlow, O. Carm. Maxine expanded her choir work at St. Paul's at Saturday Night Masses. Throughout her tenure as choir director, her choir joined in singing at the Shrine at simple professions, ordinations and other special services. Since 2004 Maxine has been at the helm of the Shrine as the choir director.

"I don't think of myself as the boss, being the choir is a team effort to create beautiful, inspiring music. Our collective goal is to touch the hearts of the people to whom we are ministering."

Maxine added that everybody in the choir is valuable. "I recognize my gifts and my limitations," Maxine said. "Where there is talent, I want to encourage it to grow."

When not in the choir loft, Maxine serves as the bookkeeper for four different Catholic churches in the area, one of them being here at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Mount Carmel.

Maxine is blessed with a son and two daughters, four grandchildren here in the United States and a brother and mother, who just turned 100 years old, living in Vienna, Austria.

When not working, Maxine's favorite pastimes are vegetable gardening and simply being outdoors to revel in nature's beauty.
